Safety First!

I'm sure many people have heard the story of an elderly man of 72 years and his small dog who died in his, new to him, 2007 C6 Corvette in June, 2015. He apparently went to his favorite restaurant to eat and when he got up to leave, he got into his car and realized he forgot his phone in the restaurant. He tried to get out of his car but apparently the battery had either died or had a loose cable connection or maybe even the fob has lost its power. Either way, he struggled to get out of his Corvette and passed away from heat exhaustion along with his dog. It was a very tragic ending for a person to be killed by his favorite car.



While many Corvette owners know that the later models; C6, C7 and C8 Corvettes, have an emergency release latch on the sides of the door sill. Many times the passengers or the spouses do not know of this feature... especially owners who are new to their cars. This happened to my neighbor a year ago who is driving around with her friend in her husband's Corvette and for whatever reason, they were unable to open the doors. They struggled with the door until the driver called her husband and finally got through to him to explain how to open the door. I was talking to a Corvette owner at Gambler's Classic this year who was proud of his 'new to him' Corvette and I casually asked him if he knew about the emergency door release latches. He was an older man and I was surprised to learn that he did not know about the latches making me think that this is a very common occurrence. Can you imagine being in an accident and having a power failure and not being able to open the door. I feel every Corvette owner should educate their passengers in this very important feature as soon as they get in the car for a drive.

On another note, in case of a power failure, there are other ways of getting **into** your Corvette which include hidden key holes and pull cables. You should familiarize yourselves with each method as they are different between the C6/C7 and C8 models. The C8 is quite different and that it has keyholes under body panel behind the door handles to open the doors and a key hole behind the license plate to open the rear engine/trunk compartment. To open the front trunk, there is a cable with a loop on the end if it on the floorboard right where the steering wheel goes into the firewall. The battery sits under the trim panels of the frunk. Question everyone you know about these features and educate your passengers as soon as they get into the car. Happy motoring!
