T he following pages are a memorial to an extraordinary man written by members of the Santa Clara Corvette Club by those members who knew him best. They were the recipients of Jack and Yolanda's many talents in organizing runs and modifying their Corvettes.

Noticed that on their long distance runs, each Corvette was equipped by CB radio for communication...all installed by Jack Atkinson.

Many Santa Clara Corvette club members were the recipients of Jack's talents where you will see many of the vehicles adorned with vinyl appliqués. He was very gifted in creating and modifying body panels. If you examine his personal C6 Corvette, rear and front spoilers and ground effects were also created by him. To top it off, he would splash some color on his vehicles with vinyl appliqués; all designed, cut and installed at his home with the help of his wife, Yolanda. He would also paint as needed.

He had a long history of designing body panels for his cars starting off with three versions of the Datsun 240Z which he called the Primadonna Z. two of them are currently undergoing restoration. As time went on he modified body panels for the later model 300ZX and had two beautiful examples of his work. A black 300ZX and a white one, both also called Primadonna Z.

Never content with one design, he always changed it on a whim to where you will see different reiterations of his car and swear they were different cars.

Jack was fortunate because he was able to repeat this open-road scenario numerous times, in numerous vehicles with numerous participants. He and Yolanda researched, planned, organized and participated in many "runs" to various exotic locales. Whether it was he and Yolanda by themselves or with a group of invited guests like a trail of ants across the ribbons of highways...the theme song was always "On the Road Again". Jack's passion for the open road was infectious which prompted many to participate in their legendary road trips. There were always more who wanted to participate than space available. It wasn't only the group from Santa Clara Corvettes who were part of the

It didn't take much to make Jack Atkinson a happy man. Just provide a trusty steed (insert Corvette, NSX or Z-Car), a deserted highway and the love of his life, Yolanda, and he would be in heaven. The only other item possibly missing in this idyllic scene would be ice cream but that would not be a problem for Jack knew every ice cream stop along the way.



Atkinson's "car family"-there were other car enthusiasts that Jack worked with and other clubs they belonged such as: Corvettes of Bakersfield; Diablo Valley Corvettes; and several Z-Car and NSX clubs.



Jack and Yolanda were magicians at packing up their cars for trips. They took pride in devising the optimal methods for packing the most amazing amount of clothing, drone, car parts, extra electronics in case someone in their group had a problem with their equipment, cooler with food and drink. two folding chairs and tools. There was barely space for an additional pack of gum and yet it always looked organized and they always knew right where to look for anything.

Each mealtime on these road trips **Jack** and **Yolanda** would first ensure that everyone was seated and served in proper order. It always seemed that **Jack** would be the last to be served and yet was finished first and would spend the remainder of the time available visiting each

table to chat with as many participants as was possible. He was always able to answer their many questions as to itinerary, history of the area or site and he would always inquire how they were enduring the trip.

Jack Atkinson: Renaissance Man

While **Jack Atkinson** was known far and wide as a "car guy", few realized the depth of his knowledge and abilities. **Jack** was a true Renaissance Man in that he could design cars, fabricate body panels, design graphics for vinyl appliqués, paint cars as well as design them, photography and video droning as well as fabricating several models of "wings" for Corvettes belonging to himself and other club members. These wings were artistic, aerodynamic and sturdy-all are still in daily use to this day.

Jack had an artist's "eye" when it came to looking at the lines of a car and visualizing where the vinyl accents would be best placed to accentuate those lines depending upon how the light would hit the car. Once that was decided, he would then choose which colors of vinyl would best enhance the appearance of the car. He was a perfectionist in everything he endeavored and he wouldn't be satisfied until all shapes and colors were just right.

Jack tended to buy white cars to enhance with his art because it was like starting



with a blank canvas and white gave him more colors to choose from that would transform the car into his masterpiece.

Over the years as the **Atkinsons** collaborated on different tasks they became even more of a team than the normal husbandwife team. They would draw up the designs, she would operate the computer to produce the designs on vinyl and he would apply the designs to the cars. They drove together on all their various trips with their many car clubs and they both enjoyed attending club events together.



It seemed a natural joining of their names, **Yolanda** and **Jack** to form **Team YOJACK!** They were definitely a team... in their professional life, their social life and their private life-always together.

Remembering Jack - Ray Gee

Friday night, July 15, the phone rang at 10:32 P.M.. I expected the worst as no good news ever comes this late at night. Caller ID shows that it's **Yolanda** calling and I answer with trepidation. Everyone knows that **Jack** has been very sick the past three years and hasn't been doing well. This is the phone call that I've been dreading to get. Yolanda confirms that **Jack** passed away earlier that afternoon at home. She plans a celebration of life memorial for sometime in September or October.

After hanging up the phone, I sat quietly and reflected on all the good times and memories we shared over the years. It would be safe to say that everyone in Santa Clara Corvettes knows **Jack** and **Yolanda**. They've been involved with the group from the moment they first joined. Who hasn't had vinyl graphics designed and installed on their car or had a CB radio or rear wing installed by **Jack**? Who hasn't partaken on one of their fun and fabulous road trips?

Betty and I first met Jack and Yolanda back in the late 70s or early 80s via ZONC (Z Owners of Northern Calif) when we both owned Datsun Z cars. Jack had always been creative and talented even back then and modified his Z car, not in a lighted and heated garage but in an outdoor car port. In his first major project, he created his most famous car, the Primadonna Z. ZONC used to put on car shows/membership drives at the Tanforan Mall in San Bruno and the Fashion Island Mall in Foster City. The Primadonna Z was always a hit at these shows.

Jack built three Primadonna Zs. Two are still around with the first car's whereabouts unknown up until recently. It's been located after being lost for decades and Jack was able to repurchase the car. The Z Car Garage in San Jose is currently restoring the car. Yes, the Atkinson's used to own a motor home. These trips were all before they bought their C6 Corvette and joined Santa Clara Corvettes. Once they joined, they started organizing road trips for SCC. Once word got out about their legendary road trips, people signed up immediately whenever a new trip was announced even before the destination and itinerary were finalized. Their trips were well planned and well organized with Jack leading the group in his white and orange C6.

Over the years, we've been to the Boeing Museum of Flight in Seattle, several military plane displays (including the SR-71 Blackbird), the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum in Washington D.C. and several other museums I have forgotten the names of. The irony is, as much as he liked to visit these places dedicated to aviation, he was afraid of flying. That is why he's never visited his home country of England. That's a long eleven hours in a metal tube, flying across the Atlantic Ocean.

Betty and I have been on several of their trips and we will always cherish the memories, fun times and laughter shared and being able to see this beautiful country from the ground, one mile at a time. Jack, you will be missed but never forgotten. Rest well my friend.




them.

I met Jack at dinner on the Poppy run he and Yolanda organized in 2013. Even though we had just met, Jack invited me to go on the next drive to the Arches National Park which became the second of nine YoJack trips I was fortunate to take. These trips allowed me to see and do things I never would have done on my own including national parks, historic sites, museums, concerts, train trips, rodeo, jail (as a tourist), and much more. On these trips I became good friends with Jack and Yolanda and with David Johnston who I rode with.

He flew his drone on our trips, sometimes driving ahead so he could video us as we passed by. If a car had a problem **Jack** was always in the middle of people trying to fix it.

He designed artistic or clever T-shirts for each trip. He even put vinyl on their kitchen appliances so they wouldn't show fingerprints.

One can not think of **Jack** without also thinking about **Yolanda** and the loving relationship they had.

In addition to cars and travel, **Jack** loved good desserts and ice cream. And **Jack** also loved animals. In Chinle, Arizona, during the 2017 SCC trip **Jack** and **Yolanda** led, **Jack** was distraught to the point of tears over two emaciated stray dogs roaming our Holiday Inn. He fed them his lunch, and he and **Yolanda** spent hours finding a shelter that promised to come get and care for the dogs. At home he fed the birds everyday and after moving from South San Francisco to Tehachapi he enjoyed the larger variety and size of wildlife that surrounded the house even though the deer ate their plants and the bears sometimes rapped on the windows. **Yolanda** and **Jack** already had five domestic cats when **Jack** befriended a feral cat in Tehachapi. "Buddy" started coming daily, and **Jack** built a special entrance for him into the garage, where Buddy still spends most nights and can always find food, water and protection from the weather, bobcats and bears.

BYLAWS OF CORVETTES OF BAKERSFIELD, INC. THIS CORPORATION IS A NONPROFIT MUTUAL BENEFIT CORPORATION ARTICLE II OBJECTIVES AND PURPOSE

Section 1: GENERAL PURPOSE

To promote private and public interest in Corvettes, arrange social activities and club functions, and promote and assist charitable organizations through and in conjunction with "Corvettes of Bakersfield Charity, Inc.", our affiliated corporation.

Section 2: SPECIFIC PURPOSE

To encourage interest in the ownership of the Corvette, to stimulate a sense of pride of ownership by Corvette owners, to organize and promote Corvette related activities with other car clubs, to promote and enhance the Corvette's public image, to disseminate information regarding the advantages of ownership of Corvettes and to obtain increased benefits and services for the Corvette owner.

SAVE the WAVE!

Learn the WAVE!

The Corvette Wave is an integral part of the mystique and culture of the Corvette owner experience. Corvette owners who wave at fellow Corvette owners when they pass on the road, show a mark of recognition that you are among the elite group of intelligent people who are driving America's True Sports Car. And as a member of this elite group, you should be recognized for your poise and intelligence. So for those who don't know the five simple Corvette Wave rules, here they are:

- 1. There is no excuse for not waving at your fellow Corvette owner. Although most Corvette owners have the class and understanding to accept when their wave is not returned, not waving is a serious breach of proper Corvette etiquette.
- 2. Whoever sees the other Corvette first, starts the wave. There isn't any rule about who waves first. This is simple; if you see another Corvette, wave!
- 3. Rules 1 and 2 apply to both sexes.

As far as who starts the wave, it doesn't make a difference if you are a man or woman. Rules 1 and 2 apply.

4. Any type of wave is okay.

Whether you shoot a big wave up through your open Vette top, out the window, or a quick salute with your hand on the steering wheel, any wave that can be seen by the other Corvette driver is okay. However, this does not include any style of gesture that can be interpreted as obscene or insulting. Remember, Corvette owners are a class act; while someone might have been rude or stupid to you, try not to return the favor. (This is a tough rule not to break with all the stupid drivers who manage to get a driver's license.)

5. A late wave is better than no wave.

If you suddenly realize that a Corvette driver is passing and waving at you, get a wave off as soon as possible. The other Corvette driver may see your wave in their rear view mirror and realize that you were just a little late in getting your wave going. Although missing the timing of your wave is a "goof," getting off a wave that the other Corvette driver has a chance to see can acceptably cover this slip-up.

Wave at your fellow Corvette owners, whoever they are, whenever you see them. This will show you are a person who understands the full measure and etiquette that comes with your proud ownership of a Corvette.


