HISTORY OF THE GAMBLER'S CLASSIC

Ithough it has been around for more than 23 years, this is the 23rd Gambler's Classic for Corvettes of Bakersfield. The history of the COB Gamblers Classic is long and colorful and gratifying. This is a story by COB Member and early participant/organizer, Beverly Hayden:

Our first Gambler's Classic was at Lake Havasu in 1992. We set up the event on the golf course; a very small event and not all of our members were there. We had the club house at the golf course make sack lunches for our participants. Our raffle was quite small. A young family with two children came to see the cars and we asked them if they would like to join in for the event. We shared our sack lunches with them. It was a feel good day. Our first event T-shirt was of a C4 Blue Convertible on the back.

We were headquartered in Laughlin about fifty miles from Lake Havasu on what, at that time, was a single lane hiway each way.

We held the Gambler's Classic for two more years in Lake Havasu and those years the event was under the London Bridge. A great venue and much larger. However it became clear that traveling back to Laughlin from Lake Havasu after dark was not a safe idea especially when considering there were adult beverages served during the day.

Rod and I had a 1981 silver C₃ Corvette. As we traveled to Lake Havasu for the first event something flew off of our car. Everyone pulled over as we looked for the part. Anyway, the car got us into Lake Havasu where we were surprised to find a crackerjack mechanic who put the car on the rack, located the problem and fixed it. He also found a wrench lodged up under the chassis. He told Rod "you don't believe in preventive maintenance, do you?"

For two years the Gambler's Classic was held at State Line in a huge building large enough to hold their annual Rodeo. We had dinner there and a wonderful floor show. I don't remember who was responsible for getting the talent but it was fabulous. We had an Elvis impersonator where the ladies screamed like in the early days, a Jerry Lee Lewis impersonator and the play 'Mama Mia'.







y wife and I were honored and very proud to attend the dedication of the Kern County World War II Memorial at Jastro Park December 10, 2022. I was so proud to see a large crowd of over a thousand Bakersfield and Kern County citizens come out to be a part of this dedication. After a beautiful rendition of the



Star-Spangled Banner sung in 7 part harmony by high school students, we were all touched by the very emotional speeches made by the presenters and also a couple of the World War II veterans that got up to speak. Among the dignitaries that were speaking were Senator Kevin McCarthy, Senator Shannon Grove and Bakersfield Mayor Karen Goh and others including Ed Gaede, president of the WWII Memorial and Vice President Wendy Ward. Also speaking were World War II veteran and board member Walter Grainger and World War II veteran Ray Mish.

Then came the big unveiling. Who would not have a lump in your throat after viewing the statue depicting a mother holding her child and viewing a telegram that states that her soldier husband or son was killed in the line of duty. The sculptor, Benjamin Victor, did an awesome job depicting the heart wrenching emotions the mother had as she read the news. Many a tear was shed during this unveiling. The reason a mother was chosen is because she represents all the suffering and heartache resulting from the war as opposed to having a soldier representing just one branch of the military.

There are over 40 living WWII veterans in Kern County. All in their 90's and 100's. Many were present at the dedication and some even went up to speak of their experiences. It is said that we've already had a Police Memorial, a Korean War Memorial, a Vietnam War Memorial but no World War II memorial in Bakersfield; the reason being, supposedly, was that World War II veterans were humble and didn't want to talk about their experiences and didn't want to relive it.

It was definitely time to remember those veterans with the few that we have left and show the world that they were truly the Greatest Generation. This is truly a beautiful memorial with a lot of history engraved in the black granite slabs and should be considered a sacred place honoring those who helped save the world.

Corvettes of Bakersfield had a small part in bringing the WWII Memorial to fruition by donating its time and energy 4 during the Cruzin' 4 Charity Streets of Bakersfield Car Show which brought \$30,000 in proceeds that were donated to the WWII Memorial Fund.


