Fillmore Historical Museum & El Pescadero Restaurant Run

any thanks to COB event coordinator, Liz Zaninovich for organizing a run to the Fillmore Historical Museum on Highway 126 in Santa Clara County on September 9. It was a beautiful, small and very clean museum with some beautiful buildings such as the Hinckley house (a craftsman home built in 1905) the Southern Pacific Depot (built in 1887) and many other old buildings and artifacts including two cabooses from the SP railroad.

The houses were beautifully furnished with antique period pieces; most of it donated by local families, and, in the case of a huge music box, very operational.


We were treated to a slide presentation by one of the docents of a disaster that happened in March 1928 when the Saint Francis dam, just east of what is now Santa Clarita, failed sending 12 billion gallons of water down the Santa Clara River with waves 40 feet high. Over 400 people were known to have been killed in the ensuing flood. The City of Los Angeles, who built the dam, took full responsibility and compensated the survivors, families and property owners. This is just one of the many disasters that have hit the area which were presented to us.

After visiting the museum, we took the short drive through congested traffic to El Pescador Mexican restaurant. The food was delicious and was ably served by a single waitress named Nicole. After she got the orders, 26 of us quickly received our meals and boy was it delicious!

12 Corvettes made the trip over the ridge and through heavy traffic but we all made it safely and in one piece. We came across a fellow Corvette driver named Joey on the congested part of our trip to the restaurant who was interested in the club and loves to go on runs. He didn't join us for lunch, however, because he had a previous engagement to attend.

We had a great time and we all headed home after our lunch.

Flag Caddie Product Recommendation



have been asked where I got the flags that I display on my Corvette during our patriotic outings. I would like to recommend the Flag Caddie from flagcaddie.com. These flags are screwed into the holes that are exposed when you takeoff your targa top and they are made to fit 1956 and up model Corvettes, Pontiacs Solstice and Saturn Skys without any damage to your vehicle. There are different models and ways to attach these flags depending on the year of your vehicle. They are capable of being attached securely and hold tightly even at speeds faster than a parade. Custom flags are also available and replacement flags can be ordered should you need to replace them for only \$6.50 a pair. A set of two American flags cost \$31.95 plus tax, shipping and handling. These flags were designed and sold by a Northern Illinois Corvette owner who noticed that several people lost their flags during a parade and he refused to attach a couple of flags haphazardly on his 1990 ZR1 that were given to him before a parade. The rest is history and he is successfully selling his flags to fellow Corvette owners.
