To change its famous look, and to make more of a "ME" car, the #83 from both side doors and rear panel has been removed; as well as all the 'Racing Team YoJack' sign vinyl. The wrap is still intact. And yes, the outrageous and iconic carbon fiber rear spoiler still resides on the rear deck, which makes it still recognizable from the past. It is another American fun sports car. It is truly an outstanding and neat automobile. And, "OH, what A LOOKER". One unique item to see is the saying printed on both bottom rocker panels: "Yea, it's good to be bad". Hence the Bad.







Discreet Tracking Device for your Corvette

I came across this device on Amazon and thought I would share it with you. I've been using an Apple Airtag hidden in our Corvette for a while now. This allows me to locate the vehicle with the Find App that is built into the iPhone. The downside is that the small coin sized battery only lasts for nine to twelve months. The Elevation Lab TimeCapsule AirTag allows the AirTag to last for 10-years.

You simply install your AirTag in the waterproof housing and add two Lithium AA batteries. Once you pair it with your iPhone, you hide it in your vehicle. You now have ten years of knowing where your vehicle is located just by looking at your iPhone's app.


It sells for \$20 each or a 4 pack for \$40. Apple AirTags are about \$20 each. Lithium AA batteries are about \$10.
